In an open approach, a small incision is placed across the columella, the strip of tissue separating the nostrils, allowing the surgeon a fuller view of the underlying cartilage and bone structure. A closed approach keeps all incisions inside the nostrils, which can mean less visible scarring and, in some cases, a shorter recovery. The choice between these methods depends on the complexity of the case, the specific goals of the patient, and the surgeon's assessment during consultation. This has made ethnic rhinoplasty an important area of focus for surgeons practicing in the region. Surgeons who regularly work with diverse populations tend to develop a nuanced understanding of how different skin thicknesses, cartilage strength, and bone structures respond to surgical adjustment. For patients from South Asian, East Asian, Middle Eastern, Black, and other communities, this cultural awareness can be a meaningful factor when selecting a surgeon and discussing goals during the consultation process. Approaching each case with sensitivity to these differences, rather than a single template, helps ensure that the surgical plan reflects the patient's own priorities rather than a generic standard.

Beyond aesthetic considerations, many patients seek rhinoplasty to address functional breathing problems, such as those caused by a deviated septum or narrowed nasal passages. In these cases, the procedure may combine cosmetic refinement with structural correction, sometimes referred to as septorhinoplasty. A thorough consultation typically includes a discussion of both the patient's aesthetic goals and any functional concerns, along with an examination to determine whether internal structures are contributing to breathing difficulty. Recovery from rhinoplasty varies from patient to patient, but there are general patterns most people can expect. Most patients can return to non-strenuous daily activities within one to two weeks, though strenuous exercise and contact sports are typically avoided for a longer period. It is worth noting that the final results of rhinoplasty often take up to a year or more to fully settle, as subtle swelling can persist beneath the skin long after the visible healing is complete. Following a surgeon's post-operative instructions closely tends to support a smoother recovery process. Patients are typically advised to avoid sun exposure on the healing area, sleep with the head elevated, and attend follow-up appointments so the surgeon can monitor

healing and address any concerns as they arise. Setting realistic expectations about this gradual timeline before surgery can help patients feel more prepared throughout the process.
